Ernest C. Nanners, Jr., age 78, of Buckhannon, died Saturday, November 4, 2017, at Mon General Hospital in Morgantown. He was born in Shenandoah, Pennsylvania on July 2, 1939, a son of the late Ernest Charles Nanners, Sr. and Mary Baltascavage Nanners. He was united in marriage on May 24, 1963, to Dorothy Lucille Smith Nanners who survives. In addition to his wife, he is survived by two sons: Kenneth C. Nanners and wife Stephanie of Wheeling, WV and Steven Brian Nanners and wife Jennifer of Buckhannon; seven grandchildren: Brett, Caroline, Benton, Madeline, Brady, Brian, and Patrick Nanners; and one sister, Elaine Brockman of Florida.

Mr. Nanners served in the United States Army. He was formerly employed at St. Joseph's Hospital from 1966 to 2008.

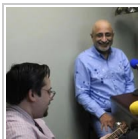
